A Short Account of the LIBRARY.

HE Library-Company was form'd in 1731, by Conflitutions or Articles entred into by 50 Perfons, each oblighing himself to pay 40 s. for purchasing the first Parcel of Books, and 10 s. per ainsum to defray Charges and encrease the Library.

Ten Directors or Managers of the Library, and a Treasurer, are chosen

yearly by Vote, at a General Meeting of the Company.

yearly by vote, at a General Breeding of the Company.

The Number of Members are now encreased to upward of 70. Persons enclining to be admitted, apply to any one of the Directors, who nominates them at the next monthly Meeting of Drectors; and being allowed, and paying to the Treasurer the Value of a Share at the Time, and signing the Articles, they become Members.

Any Member may borrow a Book for 2, 3, or 4 Weeks, leaving his Note for double Value, and paying a final Penalty if tis not return d at the Time aeread: which Penalties are applied to defraying Charges, or pur-

chafing more Books.

Every Member has an abfolute Property in his Share; may devife it in its Will, or disjoine of it when he pleafes to any Parfon the Drecheta approve. And Shares for fold have always hitherto yielded as much as they had coft. As Shares energies yearly in Value to 1.6 much, being yearly added by each Subferiber to the Stock of Backs, a Share which at first was worth but 40.5 is now values at 6.1 to 1. But for this final! Sum, which, hid out in Books, would go but a little Way, every Member has the Ule of a Library now worth upwards of 500.1 whereby Keweludge is in this City render'd more cheap and eafy to be come at, to the great Pleafure and Advantage of the fluidious Part of the Inhabitants.

Those who are not Subscribers may notwithstanding borrow Books, leaving in the Hands of the Librarian, as a Piedge, a Sum of Money proportion'd to the Value of the Book borrow'd, and paying a small Acknow-

ledgment for the Reading, which is apply'd to the Ufe of the Library.

The Library is open and Attendance given every Saturday Afternoon from 4 a Clock 'til 3.

Befides the Books in this Catalogue given to the Library, the Company have been favour'd with feveral generous Donations; as, a curious Air-Pump, with its Apparatus, a large double Microfopes, and other valuable Interments, from the Hon. Jown Penn, Eg; A haddone Lot of Ground whereon to build a House for the Library, from the Hon. Thom As Penn, Eg; Proprieturies of the Province; and the Sun of 34 h. Sterl. (to be laid out in Books) from Dr. Sydlerfe, Lute of Astigua.

At present the Books are deposited in the West Wing of the State-House,

by Favour of the General Affembly.

It is now Ten Years fince the Company was first established; and we have the Pleasure of observing. That the "tis compos' of so many Persons of different Sets, Parties and Ways of Thinking, yet no D. distences relating to the Affairs of the Library, have anisen among us; but every Thing has been conducted with great Harmony, and to general Satisfaction. Which happy Circumfance will, we hope, always continue.
